

Giving Yourself Credibility



- >Know AND Follow the Rules
- >Be Honest
- ► Be Fair "Life isn't fair, but you can be."
- ➤ Be Trustworthy "Trust is like Credit, it Takes a Long Time to Build and One Bad Moment/Choice to Destroy it."
- >Say What YOU Mean
- >Don't take one person's word, if you don't have to; investigate




Transparency in ALL things \$\$\$\$\$\$

- ➤ Monthly Financial Reports; Make Copies and Share with Anyone who has questions.
- ➤ Event/Fundraising Financial Reports — Do this after each fundraising endeavor
- Include the athletes in the decision making for ALL spending and fundraising
- >DON'T ASSUME!





OHSET is NOT Part of Your Business Model



- >Keep your horse business separate from OHSET
- >No special treatment for students
- >OHSET functions are volunteer for ALL
- >If you're loaning a horse, equipment, etc., YOU must separate that from team "stuff"



Be a Coach


- >Be a Leader
- >Prepare your athletes as human beings
- >Engage with your athletes as a coach inspire them
- >Be Creative, keep them engaged
- >Keep training multifaceted
- >"Performance Practice"
 - > Teach, practice, practice like it's game time

- >Want to motivate your athletes?
 - >Engage with them
 - >Be Motivated, Passionate
 - >Keep Learning Yourself
- >Provide Opportunity for Team Building
 - >And still teach individually

Who has final say?

- >What is the job difference between Advisor and Coach
 - > Coach and Assistant Coach
 - > Head Coach and Drill Coach
- >Put it in writing in your team rules
- ➤If the school is making disciplinary decisions, you need to know
 - > We always respect their wishes, we can't have a team without their support

Build a Relationship

- >With the AD or person in charge of the team at the school
- >Make sure they don't just hear from you when there is trouble



Parents are People too, But... And...

- >Sometimes they need to be reminded...
 - >This is the athletes' team
 - Their athlete is in high school and it's time for the athlete to share their feelings
 - >It's a life skill that young people MUST learn to advocate for themselves
 - >What is best for the team, may not always be what they think is best for their child





AND...



- >Sometimes, we need to be reminded...
 - >We couldn't do what we do without them
 - The student athlete couldn't do what they do without the parent
 - >Parents are our largest source of volunteer labor
 - >These are THEIR children

Two Quality Programs

- > Can/Should be complimentary
- >Different Missions
 - >4-H is Youth Development
 - >OHSET Provides Competitive Opportunities
- >Different Ages
 - >4-H is 4th-12th (k-19)
 - >OHSET is High School (8th graders)
- > Different Rules, Events, Priorities





- >Outstanding Youth
 Development Program
- >Great at teaching and practicing life skills
- >NOT competition focused
- >Exhibiting against a standard, not each other
- >Club, does not necessarily mean Team





OHSET



- >Team Event Opportunities
- >Equine & Competition Focused
- Compete against each other, individually, as a team, as a district, and finally as a state
- >Also, some leadership and youth development opportunities, but not the focus
